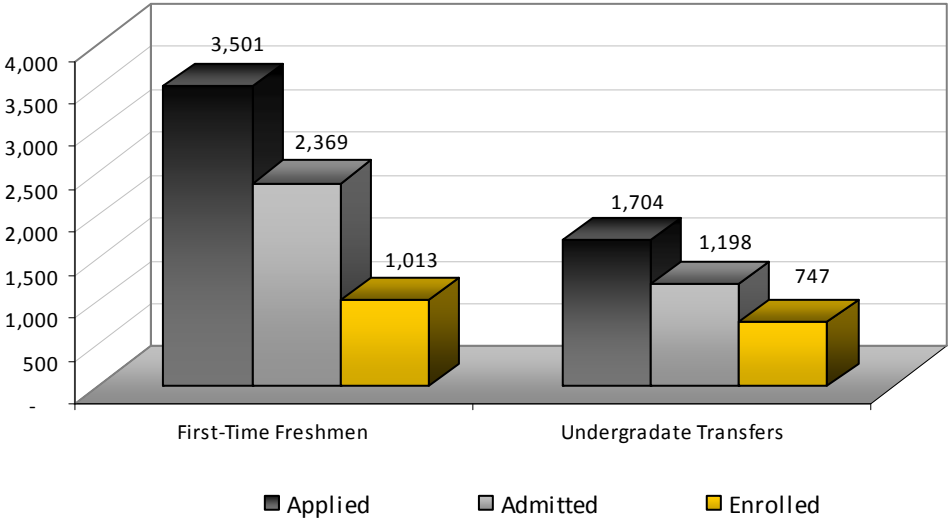

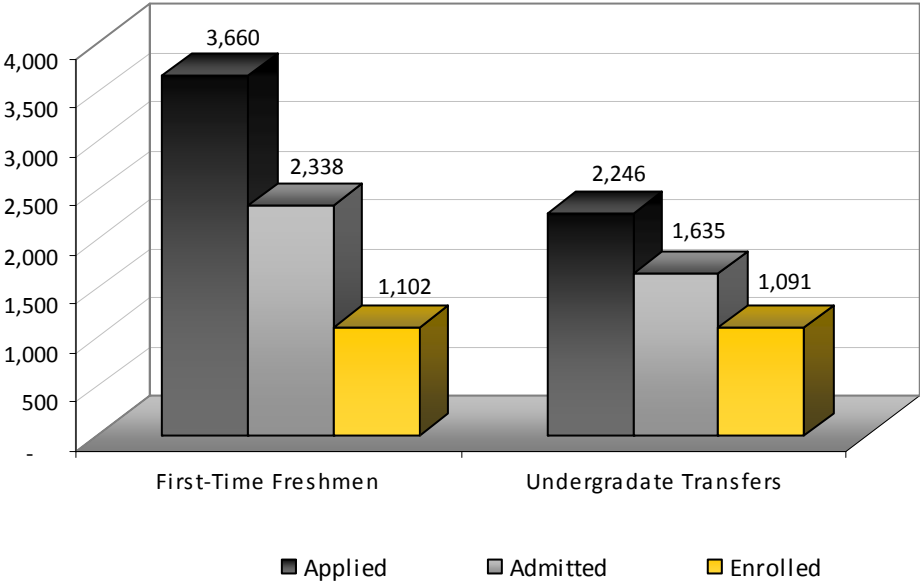

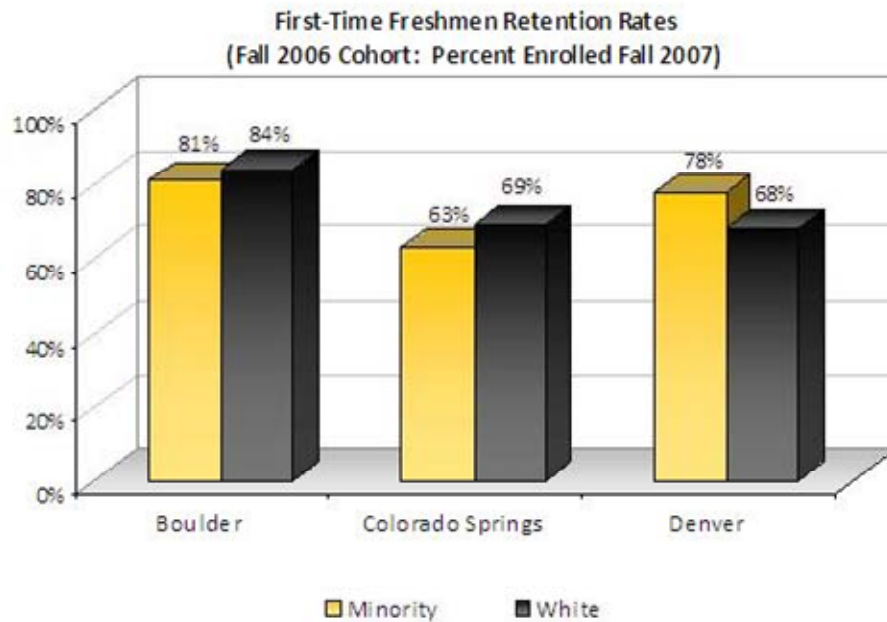

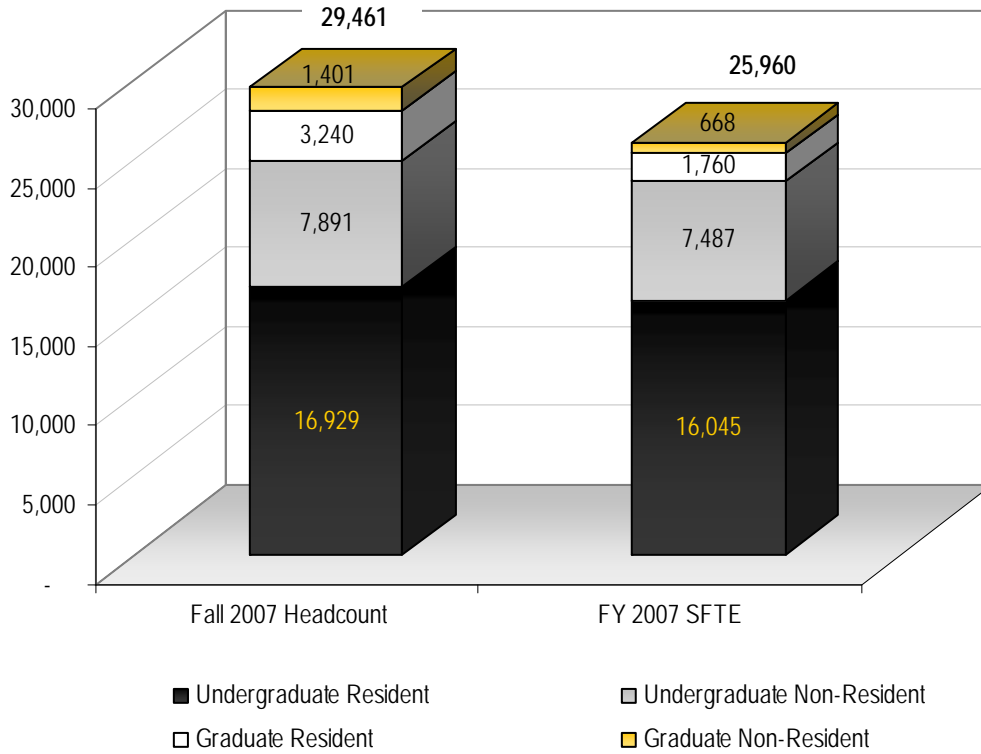

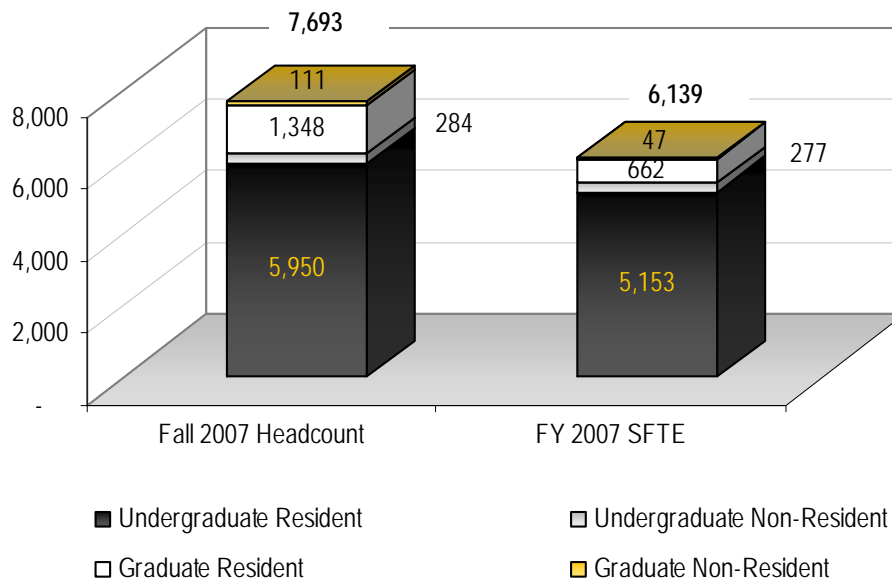

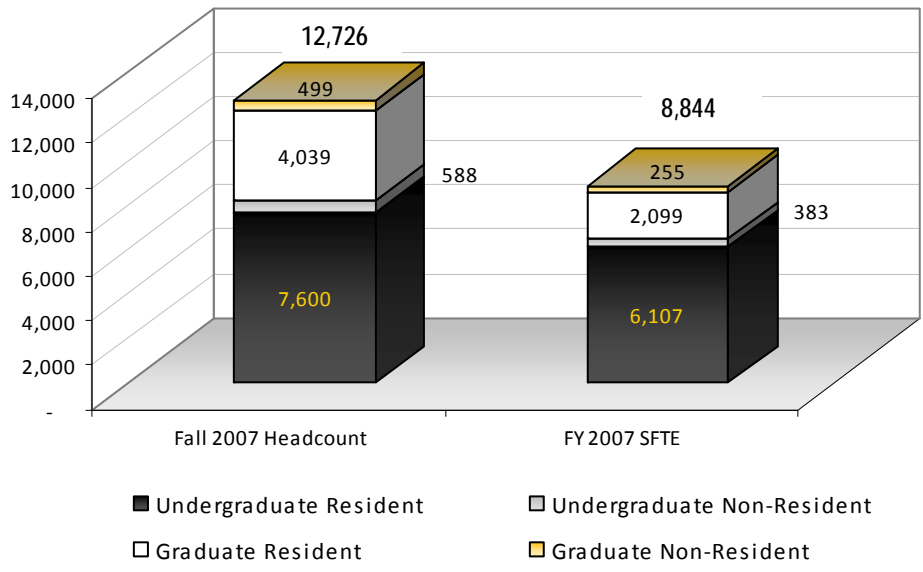

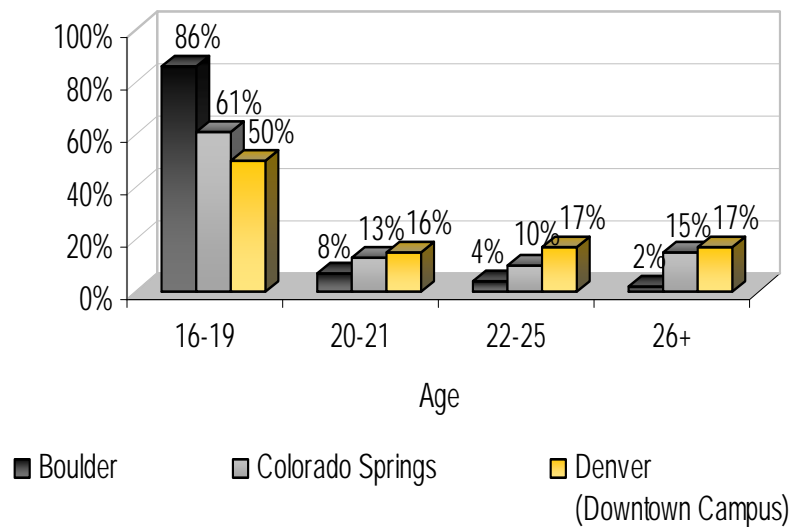

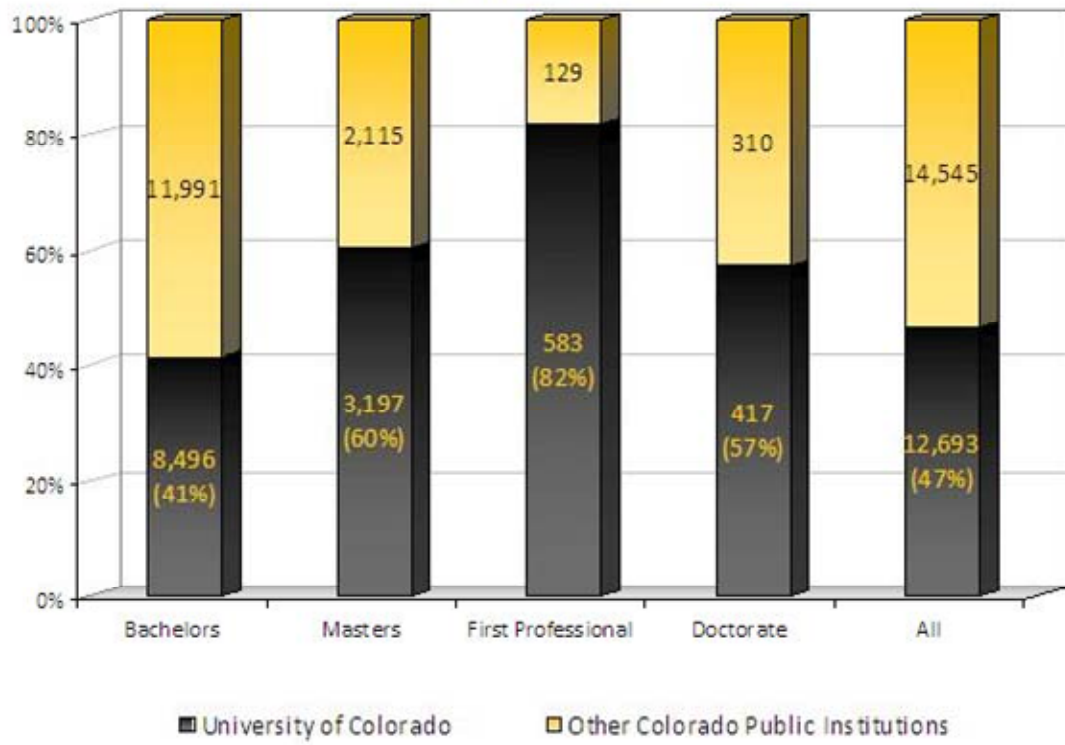

Degrees Awarded, FY07



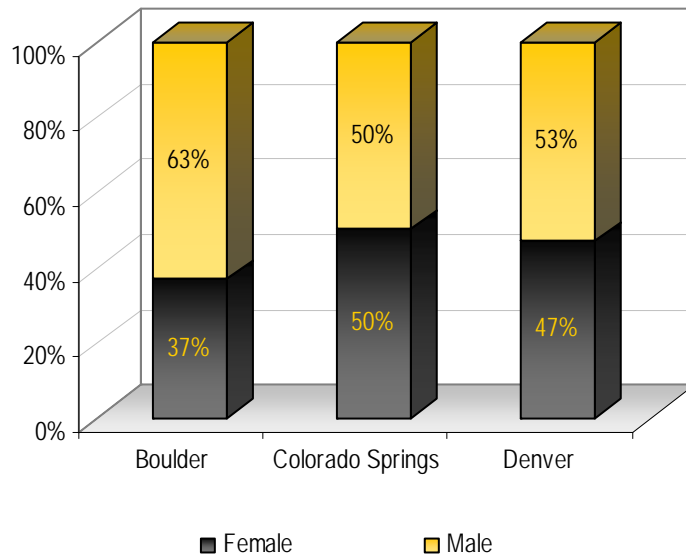

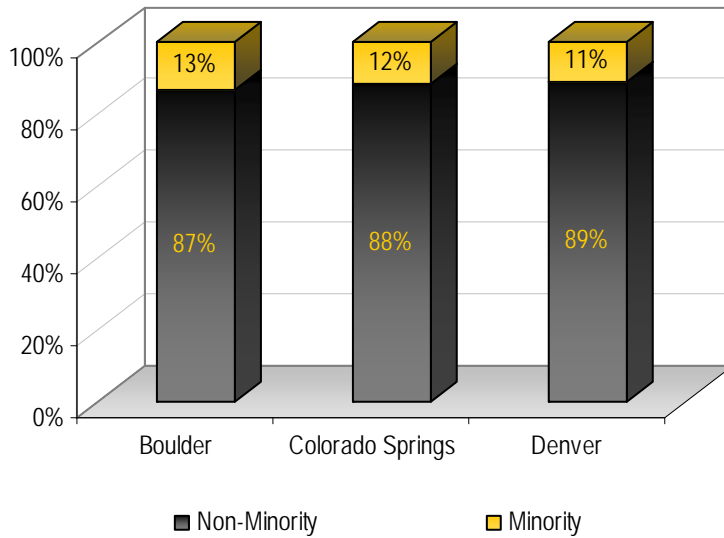

Regular Instructional Faculty by Minority/Non-Minority Status, Fall 2007



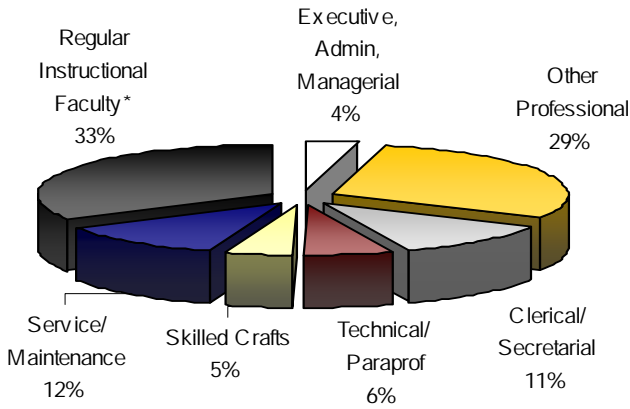

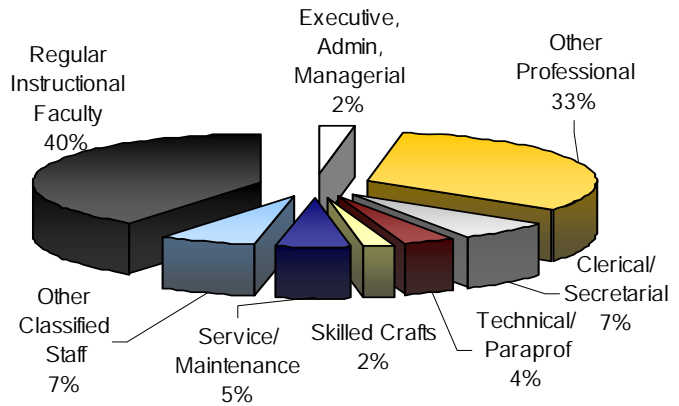

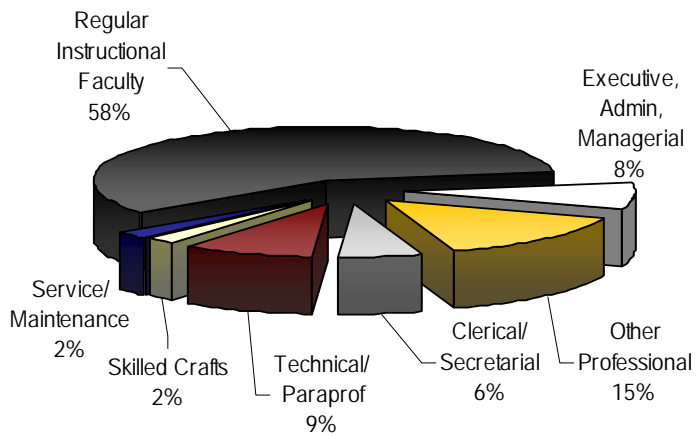

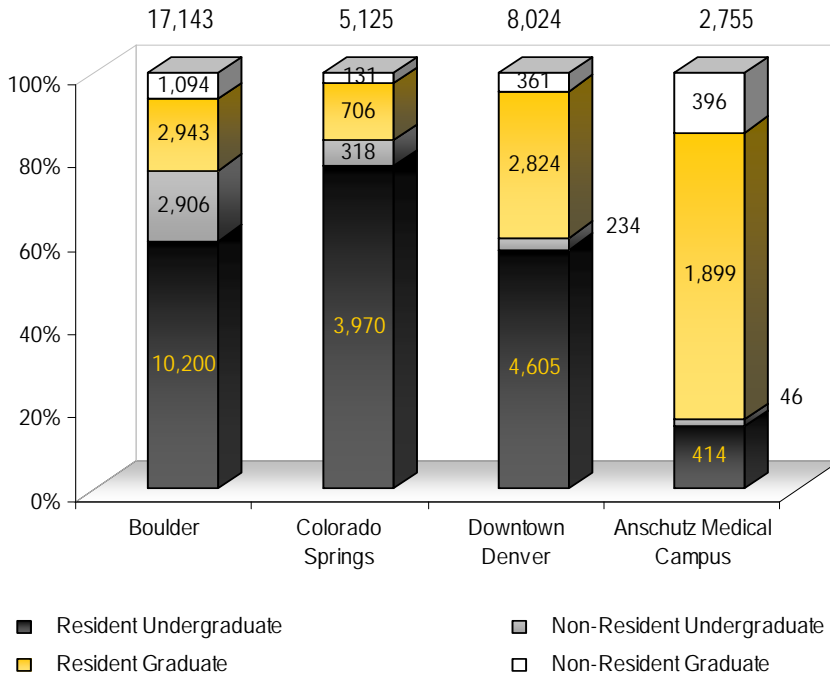

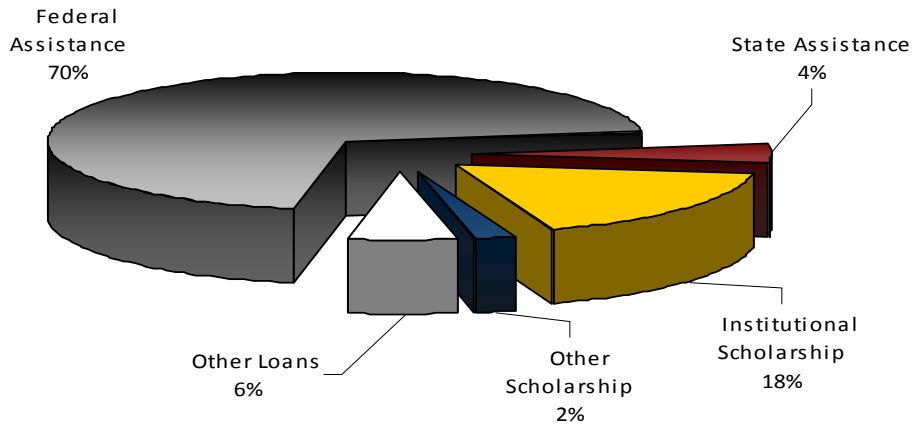

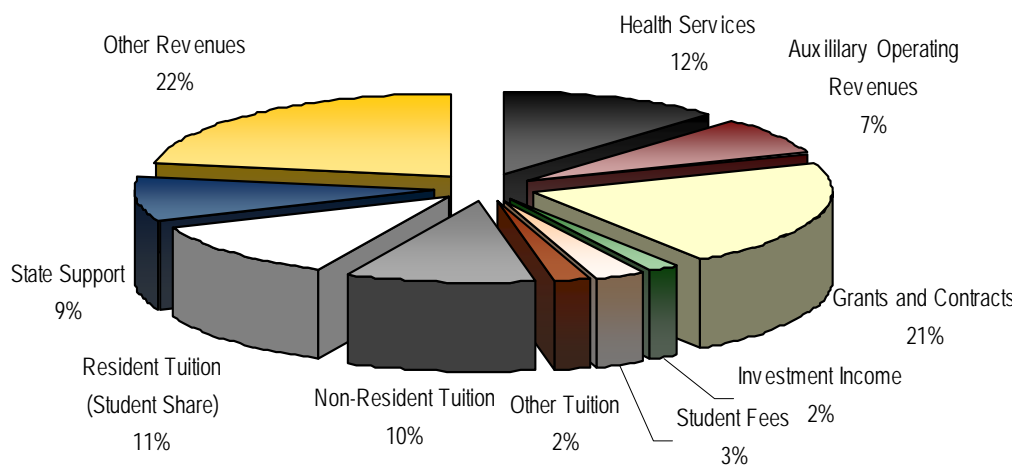
