## **Article 4: Academic Organization and Program Planning**

In May 2024, the Regent Governance Committee approved a five-year schedule for the continuing formal review of all regent laws and policies. As part of this process, **Regent Article 4: Academic Organization and Program Planning** is currently under review.

The initial draft of Article 4 posted as "Draft 0" on the Regent Law and Policy Review website included minor proposed updates from the administration. This draft was posted for stakeholder feedback last Fall. All comments received through a deadline of February 14, 2025, were reviewed and considered. Some additional suggested updates are incorporated in "Draft 1" now posted for further feedback through April 24, 2025. Draft 1 is on the agenda for first discussion at the Regents Governance Committee on March 25, 2025.

Article 4 was last reviewed and affirmed by the regents in January 2018.

## Part A: Academic Units

- Minor edit is proposed to correct capitalization error.

## Part B: Degree Programs and Other Credentials

- Minor edit in line 22 proposed to clarify that records of degree program approvals by the Board of Regents be maintained by the System Office of Academic Affairs rather than the Office of the President, which reflects the practice.
- Language added in lines 28 32 describing the Board of Regents delegation of the creation and discontinuance of non-degree credentials to the chancellors (with a requirement that the regents be informed) unless regent approval of these non-degree credentials is required by external entities.
- The language in lines 28-32 replaces the language in lines 24 26 which is consequently recommended for removal.
