6. UNIVERSITY AND CLASSIFIED STAFF

Policy 6.E: Principles of Staff Government

6.E.1 Colorado’s Constitution vests the Regents of the University of Colorado with the governance and general supervision of the University of Colorado. In accordance with regent law (article 6, part A), and in recognition of the staff’s role in the function of the university, the Board of Regents recognizes that staff should participate in shared governance.

(A) The nature of that participation varies according to the nature of the decisions in question. The Board of Regents receives regular updates from the University of Colorado Staff Council (UCSC) as a representative of CU staff members on all campuses and System Administration. Each campus within the University of Colorado system shall recognize a staff shared governance organization that represents staff interests and advises the campus chancellor and the campus administration on issues that pertain to staff interests.

6.E.2 University and classified staff via their participation in UCSC and their campus staff shared governance organizations shall have the ability to evaluate policies that pertain to staff interests and are asked to participate in the selection and evaluation of university leadership through processes defined in regent policy, system administrative policy statements and campus policies.

6.E.3 UCSC and campus staff shared governance organizations may recommend policies and procedures for consideration by the system and campus administrations. The discussion and review of those recommendations shall be a collaborative effort between the UCSC, or the staff shared governance organizations and the appropriate system or campus administrators.
