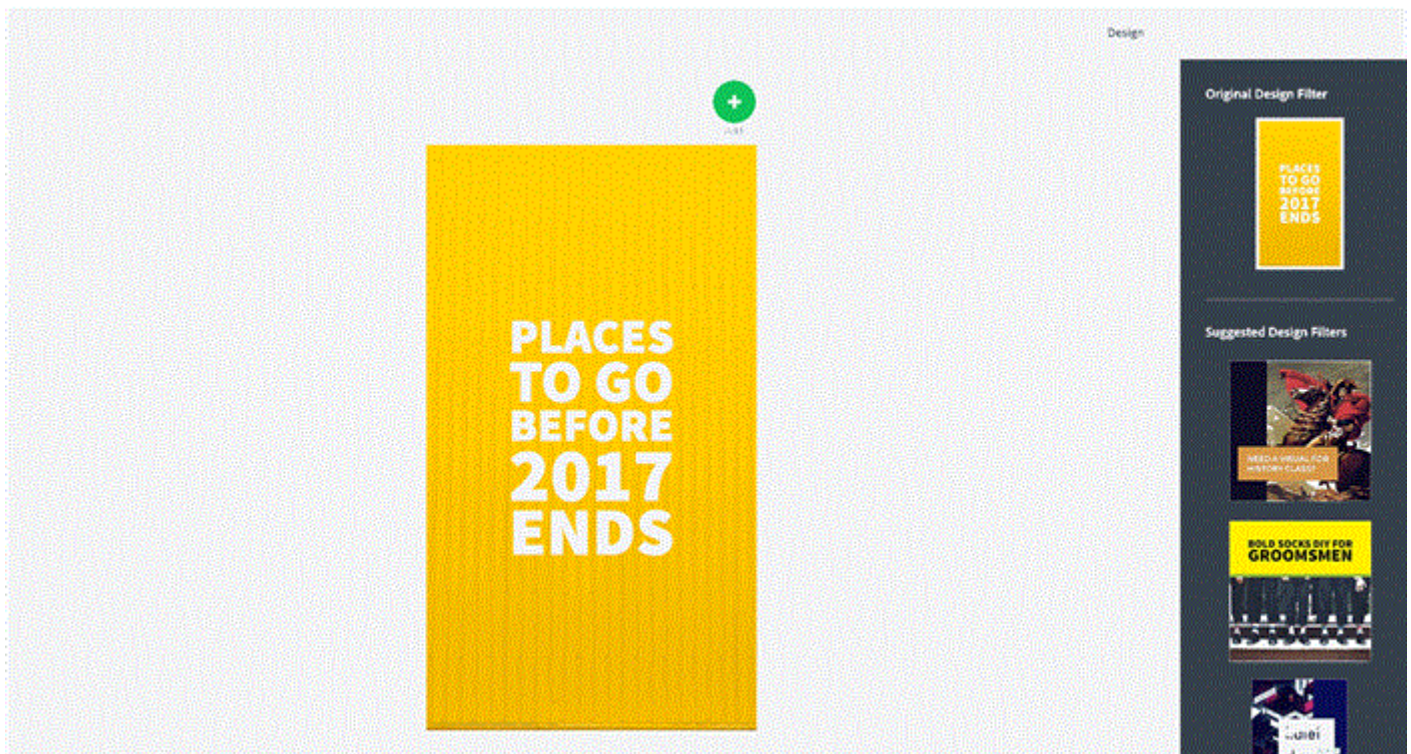

Adobe Spark starts out by giving you a wide range of templates that can be customized so you can create graphics, videos and webpages. With these templates you can easily change the text, graphics or other elements to make powerful multimedia for your courses.

Adobe Spark is designed to be simple enough that anyone with a decent understanding of technology can quickly create. Then once you've created your multimedia you can download to your computer it or shared via a URL.
